Who Needs NIMS Training?

Key Personnel

- **General Personnel**—Personnel with any role in emergency preparedness, incident management or response such as faculty and educators, school resource officers, counselors and bus drivers.
- **Critical Personnel**—Personnel with a critical role in response such as Incident Commander, command staff, general staff or member of another key campus emergency management team.

■ Leadership Personnel—

Personnel with a leadership role and are typically obligated to command and management during incident response in the absence of traditional incident response personnel (e.g. school incident commander)
