 - What worked, what failed, and the executives/policy makers roles and responsibilities
- **A Case Study of Operation Foxbro Recovery**

Actual local response to the nation’s first Weapons of Mass Destruction incident involving the integration of every level of government, including a school district, public health department, and risk management department.

This course involves lecture, group discussions, exercise and multimedia presentations. The participants will have a solid understanding of their roles and responsibilities in emergency management preparation, response, and recovery operations.
